COURSE SUMMARY

In 2005, an estimated 1.6 million persons were living with the loss of a limb in the United States.1 Children, 18 years and younger, accounted for 1.6% of the total with an estimated 25,000 children living with limb loss.1 Our first course, focuses on pediatric lower limb prosthetics, aims to provide a brief overview of lower limb prosthetics design and key factors when addressing the unique needs of each child with limb loss.

You will learn how to assess rehabilitation goals as children reach developmental milestones, including how to classify activity levels, accurately document care needs that support the unique prosthetic rehabilitation plan, and identify age appropriate milestones to provide patients with successful outcomes.

Target Audience: Physical and Occupational Therapists, Nurses, Case Managers, and others who provide care for this patient population.
